Thank you for your email. We really appreciate your quick response and input on this matter.

Regarding the HRIA, here is the information that I can provide:

In Alberta, an historical resource impact assessment (HRIA) covers historic, archaeological, and palaeontological resources including some types of traditional use sites identified by First Nations. Documents related to the HRIA process are not public and cannot be shared without written consent from Alberta Culture and Tourism, the provincial ministry responsible for heritage resources. What is publicly available is the summary that we provided within our environmental impact assessment, which you can find on the Town of Canmore website (canmore.ca). A couple of resources that you might find helpful are the Alberta Culture and Tourism webpage (culture.alberta.ca) and a summary of how HRIA are conducted in Alberta that is on the webpage of our historical resources consultant, Lifeways of Canada (lifewaysofcanada.com). I also appreciate passing along the profile of your local company profile. I will save this information with our procurement files for use once ready to tender the project.
