We are strongly opposed to Lehigh Hanson application to redesignate the 600 acres at NE corner of Burma Rd and Range Road 25, so he can operate an open gravel pit mine.

We started building our home and our water well in 1993 and it took us two years and a lot of hard work and effort to complete it.

We are blessed that we are surrounded by beautiful nature and we have amazing memories which we have experienced over the years with our nature friends such as a little fawn being born in a short distance from our house and we watched it grow for months and months after or our 2 little ducks which make our pond their home every year and raise a new family here or a little injured duck that laid an egg in our backyard, or a moose that steps into our little pond for a drink of water or the birds take a bath in our pond and frolic around the whole summer, or a goose that takes a stroll in our driveway.
