Repairs to my home took months to finish during which time we had to live with the threat of toxic mold build up in our house. We were able to mitigate this but it was a big problem for some of my neighbours, especially those with asthma or other breathing difficulties. My wife and I had to take weeks off work. Our daughter's school was completely inundated by the flood waters. Many children in the neighborhood were completely traumatized by the event as their homes and schools were heavily damaged. Even today, nearly eight years later, we dread every Spring season because we know that there is every chance that another flood event is a real possibility. As it was, we experienced major flooding in both 2008 and 2013. To be caught unprepared for another major flood would be inexcusable and to think of dealing with the aftermath again is too much to bear. My father's house(East Elbow Park) received 7 feet of water in his basement in 2008, we received 4 feet in 2013 and my sister's home(East Elbow Park) had her basement and 4 feet of the main floor flooded in 2013. Lives were forever changed and the stress of it all comes back to haunt us each spring. Only when the upstream mitigation is completed will there be any sense of relief. Fortunately we had the support of hundreds of volunteers, or our situation would have been far worse.</p> <p>Most importantly, the flood stole PRECIOUS time away from us with our young children who understood something bad had happened, that everyone around them was stressed and utterly exhausted, and that it wasn't safe to go home. They stayed with family (for obvious safety reasons) while we worked at the house for weeks in order to aid with the demo process.</p> <p>During this time, my husband and I would sneak back to my parents' home at night, where the kids were staying, just to have a warm shower and a warm meal (we had no power at the home). Since we had little time to spare, we could only visit for a short time with the kids before heading back. As mentioned our damage was limited (to basement damage) but any future event especially if of greater level would without doubt cause more serious restrictions on our an other individuals ability to continue to focus on providing services to the wider community. The uncertainty this creates is consistently a concern. Not good for a healthy state of mind or a good state for communities to living in. This type of effect was/is I'm sure quite widespread and reduction of the risk of this in addition to the protection of property with increased mitigation measures being implemented far more expeditiously than appears to be the current case should be a priority. Seven going on eight years and we're still discussing maybe, possibly permitting to start the most significant elements for mitigation is an asinine situation - even allowing for due diligence.

It required snow shovels to clear the mud not only from our yard, but from the inside of our home as well. For days we could not drive down our street because the mud was too deep. We eventually hired a private company to clear the mud from our street so we could get vehicles in. (Prior to that we would park at the end of our street and wade through knee deep mud to get to our home). One fireman who came down our alley in those early days post flood looked at me with tears in his eyes and called our little street 'ground zero'. He said we were the worst he had seen. Our yard was completely destroyed. Our fences were all heaved out of the ground and steps were ripped off our house and floated around to the opposite side of our yard. Patios and sidewalks were heaved and shifted from the force of the water. Our garage was completely submerged in water-most contents had to be thrown out and the garage completely gutted inside. Inside our home was even worse. Many many family treasures were lost forever and our entire basement and main floor had to be demolished down to the framework and floor joists. Essentially, our home was uninhabitable and required a complete rebuild. We were forced to rent a condominium for a full year until the reconstruction of our home was complete. Some people judged us and criticized for rebuilding in a 'flood zone'!! But what choice did we have? This is our home and life investment- and nobody was offering to buy our property from us. We feel fortunate that we were able to rebuild. Sadly, we had many neighbours who because of finances or mental health just could not deal with the anxiety and stress of being forced from their homes and trying to rebuild. Seven years later we still have empty lots and houses in our neighborhood that neighbours have been unable to sell. We love our neighborhood and are so thankful to be back living on Cliffe Avenue, but every spring brings sleepless nights and stress as we monitor the level of the river daily, hoping we will not have a repeat of 2013.

I remember feeling a sense of relief to watch the water recede to the second step only to find it lapping up onto the top step a few minutes later.</p> <p>The morning after the surge of flood waters, my husband, alone in the flooded house, dressed in the fishing waders a friend had lent him, desperate to retrieve any of our treasures he could salvage, dove into the mucky flood waters in our basement. He swam around, with only a foot of space between him and the ceiling, in search of something he could save. This feat was extremely dangerous and after the relief of knowing he was safe, believe me, he got an earful from me when he told me what he had done. He was so pleased to show me the oil painting that he had hauled out and salvaged after hosing off the flood waters. This proud man had retrieved something and was pleased to be able to present it to his family. That painting was one of only a few things we were able to salvage and now hangs again on our wall.</p> <p>Once my husband pumped out the basement using a pump & generator provided by friends, we began the demolition. It was painful to watch my teenage son break up our relatively new piano with a sledgehammer in order to haul it out of the basement and add it to the pile of our belongings on our front lawn. The entire basement was stripped, down to the studs. Furnace, ducting, toilet, carpeting; it all had to be hauled out. We learned later how costly it is to replace the entire utility room of the house.</p> <p>I remember attempting to sort through belongings as friends hauled them out of the basement, only to determine that they were unsalvageable. My heart sank when I recalled later that the boy's Christmas decorations that had been collected over the years had been thrown into the dumpster.</p> <p>Many of our friends and family came to assist with the demolition of our basement. It was possible for them to be there as they had nowhere else to go. The entire downtown was shutdown as a result of flooding in the office towers. Industry was shut down for days. An entire City shut down for days. Lost revenue, lost jobs, lost spirit.</p> <p>We survived the flood. What we may not survive is the realization that after almost 8 years later, the Springbank Reservoir is not built and we may be faced with the same situation again. It's heartbreaking.</p>

						This was probably the most devastating experience of my life! With very little notice, on the afternoon of June 19, 2013, we were forced to flee our home in Roxboro with two of our teenage children and pets. Our only notice of the impending flood evacuation was a call from our daughter who had a summer job working on the Stampede grounds, telling us that the Elbow River was overflowing its banks and that the Glenmore dam was in danger of being breached. After 3 days, when the water had receded, we were permitted to come back to the neighbourhood. The streets, sidewalks and lawns were coated in a slick layer of mud. We were shocked to see the highest water mark on the stucco of our house was chest-height and inside, the flood water had inundated all of the basement level where the home's infrastructure (furnaces, hot-water tanks, electrical panel, gas-lines, laundry appliances) was located, as well as part of the main floor. The first thing I saw when I looked down the basement stairs was all our family photo albums - 25+ years of memories - floating in about 4 feet of muddy water! The gas and electricity were off so we made a few calls to friends to locate a generator and sump-pump so that we could remove the standing water and begin the clean-up. There was no government help or even advice on how to go about the clean-up in the immediate aftermath. Unless you have lived through a massive flood of overland water, you would not realize the debris and silt that it leaves behind! This is not clear river water flowing through your house. This is water that has washed all the filth and grime from city streets, sewers and anything else upstream. Without recommendations about health precautions, we waded into this mucky water to salvage what we could of our belongings and to clean up our homes. Imagine, 1000's of people in the flooded areas facing the same challenges - getting ahold of generators, sump-pumps and hoses; arranging for dumpsters to put the ruined furniture and personal belongs in; and beginning to tear out saturated dry-wall, carpet etc with the help of friends and volunteers.

Water filled our basement and 4ft of our main floor. Immediately prior to the flood, we had moved all of our belongings out of the basement and onto the main floor to try to save them from the water. Despite these actions, almost all of our belongings were submerged and destroyed.</p> <p>When we were able to go back to our house, everything was coated in thick, foul smelling, silty mud. Sewer had backed up in the basement and everything stunk. Items had been thrown by the water - a lamp was hanging from our dining room light fixture.</p> <p>We tried to sort through our belongings to find things that we could salvage, but it was almost impossible. The mud was so thick that you could barely tell what you were holding. While we appreciated the help that we received from strangers during the clean up process, it was emotionally scarring to see them enter our homes and deem our possessions as trash. I distinctly remember one well meaning person come into our home and say "Wow, this is the worst house so far. Everything here is garbage." The volunteers took items indiscriminately and threw them out. Even items that could have been saved, like pots and pans or dishware, were taken out of our house by strangers and thrown away.</p> <p>Due to the extent of damage to the house, we ended up pulling it down after the flood.</p> <p>The flood was devastating for members of my family. Several members of my family have lasting mental health issues that stem from the 2013 flood. One family member has been formally diagnosed with PTSD. That person has been receiving ongoing medical treatment for the last eight years as a result.</p> <p>I have a recurring nightmare where water starts leaking from the walls and ceiling of my current home, filling the room until I am submerged and I wake up. I have trouble being near the river during the spring when the water levels are high, and especially when it is raining, because I experience extreme anxiety and have had panic attacks. This makes certain aspects of my daily life difficult. My drive to work involves crossing the river, which at certain times of the year causes incredible anxiety. My in-laws live in a house directly on the river, and I avoid visiting during certain times of the year because I become overwhelmingly anxious. So, we were busy building a new home, launching a new career, all while my husband worked at an Oil and Gas company. Our grade 12 daughter was applying to Universities and studying for her diploma exams. We also have 2 cats in our family.</p> <p>We moved into our lovely new home in September 2012 and the massive, destructive flood came in June 2013.</p> <p>Needless to say our family's new home was devastated. We had water up to the ceiling in our basement for 3 days before it finally began to empty. The main floor of our 2 storey home suffered damage, in the surge, that forced us to rip out the walls as soon as possible, up to the light switches, in order to save our home. This meant round the clock exhausting work for my family and all of our neighbours. We have a corner lot and that meant having both doors open, with hoses running through them, without any power for many days. Our neighbourhood looked as close to a war zone as I have ever seen, with huge mounds of peoples' lives piled up on our roads. As there was no power, no security and no consistent police force available, our garage was unprotected and our top of the line, new appliances were stolen in the wee hours by criminals taking advantage of the situation.</p> <p>My husband needed to go to Shelson Chumir Centre for an antibiotic shot due to his feet becoming infected and due to wearing boots that were too small for his feet. We lost all of our footwear on the main and basement floors; that's where our rubber boots were. I needed to go for months of physiotherapy due to plantar fasciitis.</p> <p>Our family was displaced for 14 months while we rebuilt our home. The main floor cost was double for us, as we had just finished our build and owed the bank for our building loan. Luckily AMA came through and helped us out for the basement build. The disaster recovery program helped as much as possible for the main floor build; but really didn't come close to what we needed to spend to rebuild our home to its' previous state.</p> <p>7 years later, I still avoid remembering all the family heirlooms and possessions that we lost.</p> <p>Our close, wonderful next door neighbours were ripped from our neighbourhood, never to return. A huge, higher main floor home was build next door to our home and makes our home seem non compliant to new flood plain rules, even though we had a new build that was totally compliant with flood measures at the time. Our 1912 home had never flooded over the years and was not built on a flood plain. We are now, with the new mapping, on a flood plain.</p> <p>I urge the City, the province, and the country, to pass the SR1 project and never let a natural disaster of this magnitude ever happen to the city of Calgary in the future. The cost in dollars, human experience and devastation is something that can be overcome with this important project. I still can not believe that the project has not been approved. It is shameful. I am a senior and cannot afford to go through this again, both mentally and financially. I am retired and can no longer look forward to travel, to springtime. We need to be home from May to July watching for high water, worrying if they are releasing enough water from the dam, worrying if I will end up living on the street after another flood. With climate change weather extremes are the norm.....it is time for another Calgary flood....2005, 2013, ...?. The SR1 is required and essential to the survival of Calgary. It is a simple dry dam. It was the cheapest of the essential 3 recommendations from Al Markin's committee, where they said all three were essential for effective mitigation. It is incredible it has taken more than 7 years and no flood mitigation has been done. If we flood again, we will move away from Alberta. A flood would destroy Calgary. We would not want to have to deal with another flood. We would not want to live in a province that does not do its duty. This is now over seven years ago, and I believe that further flood mitigation to prevent another catastrophic flood is critical.</p> <p>The Springbank reservoir project is not to just appease 'downtown city interests', as has been put forward by opponents to this plan.</p> <p>I understand the concerns of landowners in the immediate vicinity of the proposed reservoir. I would not like a construction project in my own backyard either, but we need to look past that and try to understand 'the greater good.' Furthermore, this is a temporary holding area, not a permanent flood wall.</p> <p>I live in Inglewood, where a flood wall was constructed, passing right through my own backyard. When I first heard of the plan to build a flood mitigation project that would go right through my backyard, I immediately realized that it would be wrong for me to oppose the project for the sake of my own selfish desires to keep my backyard the way it used to be.</p> <p>A few years after it was completed, the big flood of 2013 came, and because of the flood dyke that I supported in my own backyard, 1700 homes and over 70 businesses avoided catastrophic overland flooding.</p>
